Two PCHEA Propositions

second procedure, Article VIII – *Amendment of By-Laws*

1. In order to meet the needs of our growing association, it is proposed to amend the Pott County Home Educators' Association, Constitution & By-laws, Article V- *Officers, Election of Officers, and Voting Procedures* to include:

A Mentor Coordinator as an elected officer.

This would in turn amend Article VI –

Duties of Officers, and Event Coordinators, to add:

“The Mentor Coordinator shall work within PCHEA to match willing mentor families to those who seek advice, and support in regard to home education. the Mentor Coordinator shall be available to new PCHEA members at the fall business meeting (Back to School Fair)”.

2. In order to update our associational documents to reflect prior decisions concerning leadership of PCHEA, it is proposed to amend the Pott County Home Educator's Association, Constitution & By-law, Article V – *Officers, Election of Officers, and Voting Procedures*, to include the statement:

“ The newly elected Leader, and formerly elected Leader may share the office, if one of them is appointed Co-leader”.
